

## **Letter from the Chair**

The commemoration of the University's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary is to be marked with a gift of \$50 000 to establish a scholarship for a mature student. That amount of money, invested by University along with their other funds, will yield around \$3000 per year in perpetuity. The scholarship terms are being worked through by the Board and University and when our term deposits mature, we will finalise that donation. We are distributing \$70 000 in total. The other \$20 000 will likely go to a community project and details of that are being discussed.

The Archives working Party had a busy Christmas break (U3A never sleeps) and have now sorted all the paper records ready for depositing with The Hocken. They will be accessible if anyone wishes to consult them in future.

Our Annual General Meeting is on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> February at Salmond College. Everyone will have had the Agenda (with the names of members who are standing for the Board in 2019-2020) and also an invitation to the luncheon – it might need to be emphasised that these are two separate events and members can attend either one or both as they wish. The new lanyards to hold our name tags will be available (a swap for your old name badge) if you wish. No compulsion – so long as you wear a U3A name badge that's what matters. Other AGM papers are on the web site – please print your own and bring them along if you wish to refer to them at the meeting.

New members have been sent an insert for their name badge and if that is brought to either the AGM or the first meeting of the new Series, a lanyard will be provided.
