HISTORY AS WITNESSED BY THE FAMILY

Glimpses of the struggle to get ahead and stay ahead. "Fighting for the good life", as decribed by members of the Higham and related families. From 1450 to 1950.

Presented by Richard Higham, Lecturer, University of Otago

- **28 February** 1450 -1630 Anthony Higham, farmer and Robert Higham, mercer. Sir Richard Bingham, soldier and brother-in-law to Thomas Higham. Sir George Somers of Bermuda fame: and Shakespeare's 'Tempest'
- **7 March** 1630 1770 Alice Thornton, daughter of the governor of Ireland. The Civil War. Jack Cremer, sea captain, on trading vessels in the Mediterranean. Richard Higham, barber/peruke maker in Southwark
- 14 March 1780 1850 George Bellamy, navy surgeon, at the Battle of the Nile.

 Joseph Woodhead, navy agent and wealthy banker. Wandesford
 Comber on the 'Herald' at the signing of The Treaty of Waitangi.

 Richard Philip Higham, pawnbroker

21 March NO SESSION

- **28 March** 1860 1910 James Higham, bankrupt soap boiler and journalist in Melbourne. Thomas Sowerby, soap boiler surveyed by Booth. Dick Higham, flawed baseball star. Roper Barrett, tennis gold medallist. Grace Eyre Woodhead, social activist.
- **4 April** 1910 1939 George Stringer, illicit diarist of the First War. The Higham journals record a family's First War. HGW Woodhead, a journalist in China
- **11 April** 1939 1945 John Barrett in a Prisoner of War camp, scientific breakthroughs. Tony Higham, Eileen Higham and Betty Williams, WW I.
