This course, presented by Emeritus Professor of English, Chris Ackerley, introduces Jorge-Luis Borges, the Argentinian short-story writer, essayist, poet and translator best-known for the short stories of *Ficciones*, and *El Aleph*. These appeared in the 1940s, and their curious fusion of realism, dream, mythology and metaphysics has affirmed his reputation as one of the greatest (both loved and respected) writers of the past century. The recommended text is *Labyrinths* (Penguin, 1963 or any other edition); the best preparation is to read for pleasure, to cultivate a taste for the curious blending of essay and fiction that defines his finest works. His longest and most complex work, 'Tlön, Uqbar, Orbis Tertius', the first in the volume but the last to be discussed, is not the best place to begin; it is better perceived as the culmination of these classes than as a point of departure.

philosophically complex work.
