Edinburgh, 1859. As Alexander Monro Tertius took his last breath, the letter was on its way to his son David in New Zealand. He was to inherit a large collection of specimens, books and manuscripts collected over 150 years by the three generations of professors and chairs in anatomy at the University of Edinburgh – Alexander Monro Primus, Secundus and Tertius.

In 1871, the collection of 350 books and manuscripts left the shores of Scotland. It would take 58 years until it reached the Otago University where it is housed today.

Who were the Monros and what do we know about them? The key to these questions is in the Collection which tells the story of their lives, scientific achievements and the time in which they lived.
