CHRISTIANITY WITHOUT THEISM

A Discussion Course

For many people in the Western world today, the idea of a supernatural, personal God who sometimes intervenes in events on planet Earth – the idea known as "theism" – is a no-no. But many of these people also think the life and teaching of Jesus are a good basis on which to model their lives. David Simmers is one of these. A New Zealander, a former Rhodes Scholar and Presbyterian minister, who still preaches occasionally, he has recently published a book of about 30 short sermons under the title "Preaching Post-Theism.

Among the topics he deals with as he thinks his own way to a version of Christianity post-theism are:

Working from the bottom up" (in building an idea of God)

Using the word "spirit" rather than "Spirit"

"Choosing our God"

"The Fall - Upwards"

The Bible's take on "creation"

"Can we still use the word 'salvation'" (if so, what would it mean?)

"Constructing a believable God"

"Jesus the Jew"

"The core message of Jesus"

"Jesus' social concern"

"How faith can change" (as people mature)

In this course of six sessions, the group – limited to 20 participants – will discuss a selection of these topics. Participants will be sent a copy of the book when their applications are confirmed. The cost of the book (\$14.00) has been included in the course fee.
