Island of Secrets by Jeffrey Siger



Siger is an American lawyer living in Greece. The book is about police procedures set in Athens and gives a good picture of present day Greek society. Eight books by Siger are in the library, and they are highly recommended.

The Life of Germaine Greer by Elizabeth Kleinhenz.

The Obstacle Race - The Fortunes of Women by Germaine Greer

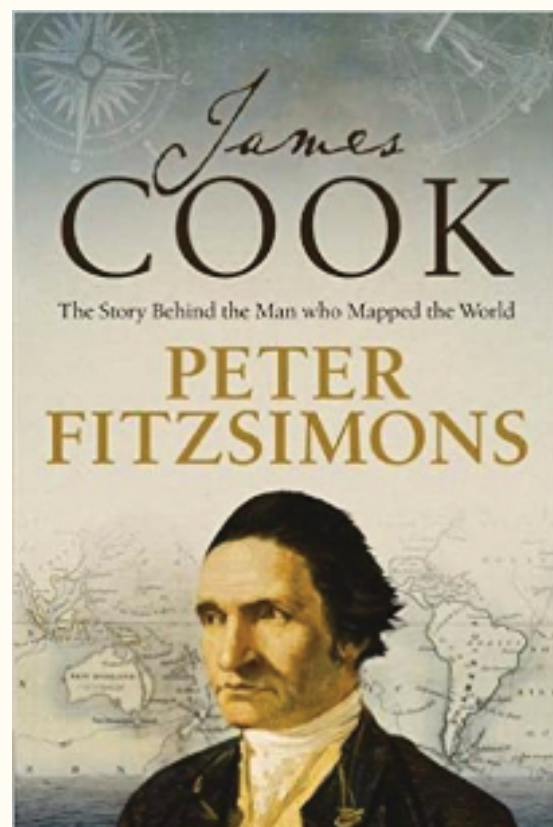
A history of the obstacles that faced and are facing women in gaining recognition in the art world!

The conclusion to the trilogy, the end of the line for Cromwell. Should be read after the first two novels, *Wolf Hall* and *Bring up the Bodies*.

Famous Art Collections Group

The topic for our second meeting was the amazing Waddesdon Manor collection. Six members attended for this presentation and discussion. In order to house his art collection, Ferdinand de Rothschild built a chateau in the French style on a hill just above the village of Waddesdon, Buckinghamshire, UK.

We looked at the history of the Rothschild family in the wider European context, and how Ferdinand de Rothschild (born in Paris) came to settle in the UK.

Waddesdon Manor is today part of the National Trust, but is still lived in by the Rothschild family.



It houses a spectacular collection of 18th century art, including a number of Reynolds and Gainsboroughs:

And we find a great painting by the woman artist Élisabeth Le Brun:

Each room is furnished with 18th century French carpets, tapestries, furniture, clocks, porcelain, armory, paintings, and even a desk of Marie Antoinette. This chateau is an unforgettable place with its gardens and stables, and even a modern art gallery in the vast park.

At our next meeting we will examine the collection of the Louvre, Paris.

Tuesday Current Affairs Group

Meeting three days after the election the Tuesday Current Issues Group spent half the meeting on this topic. Then, after coffee and cake, we moved onto Māori culture and lore beginning to be brought into NZ law.

Discussion started with the BWB book *Imagining Decolonization*, highly recommended by one member, then to the most recent appeal in the Peter Ellis case where the Supreme Court took matters of mana into account in deciding to accept the appeal even after Ellis's death.



We noted the Whanganui River as a legal person has set a precedent, and in another area the Maori Youth Courts are innovative and becoming successful in reducing reoffending.

New Zealand is in the process of developing a unique and remarkable legal system.

Finally we talked about adoption, then and now, and the effects of doing it poorly or doing it well.

Luncheon Group

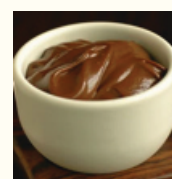


The Luncheon group has met now for the last three months on the second Friday of each month.
